Years Chileans Came To Australia™

There are roughly, according to a 2006 census, 33,525 Chileans living in Australia that immigrated from Chile.

Reasons for arrival: Economic crisis, Economic and Political Future, And the Military crisis of 1973.

If you can't understand the pie chart, 60,000 Chileans came during 1980-1984, 2,000 came during 1968-1970, 3,760 came during 1973, 2 came in 1937 (one being Benito Frains) And 500,000 came in 1990. (but, 21,000 stayed)



What is the process to migrate to Australia as a refugee?

People of Bosnia and Herzegovina can migrate to Australia by going through a refugee agency or Australian citizen. The United Nations get to choose who will be resettled based on their history. Some things the united consider include survivors of torture and/or violence, medical needs, women and girls at risk, family reunification, children and adolescents.

What reason caused the people to migrate?

The main reason many Bosnians migrated to Australia was the Yugoslavian war that started in 1992. Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia and Slovenia where all once a nation of Yugoslavia. Serbia wanted more land and power. Bosnia suffered the most due to high Muslim population's and racism they experienced. Bosnians went to seek refuge in such more developed country.



What is migration?

Migration is the movement of a person or a group of people, to settle into another place usually across a political or administrative boundary. Migration is only for a little time and it may be voluntary or forced.

There are 232 million people living outside of their country of birth.

What is immigration?

Immigration is the process of moving to a new country with plans to live there permanently. People that move to a new country are called immigrants. But from the point of view of the old country those same people are called emigrants. Emigrants are people that move away permanently the same as immigrants.

When did British people migrate to Australia?

Since European settlement to Australia began in 1788, 40 percent of who came from Britain and Ireland by 2007, 6.5 million people have migrated to Australia since 1945.
