### Reconciliation Week (27th May - 3rd June)

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The dates for National Reconciliation Week are the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

Wednesday of Reconciliation Week was a special day for Ingle Farm Primary School, our community and our local partnership. We opened our new Garden Tuwila Wardli (Too-wila Wod-ly) which is Kaurna for Sprit Place. The garden was designed to reflect the connection Aboriginal people have to land and the special relationship they have to the animals and plants. We hope that it will serve as a welcoming place that you can enjoy and admire in your own time.

The theme for National Reconciliation Week 2023, 'Be a Voice for Generations', encourages all Australians to be a voice for reconciliation in tangible ways in our everyday lives - where we live, work and socialise.

Through this theme it is important we honour the work of generations past and how it helps to shape generations to come. As a school we believed there was no better way to do that, than inviting our grandparents and significant others to share their stories from the past with our students. 












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## ROOM 29 NEWS

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
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
