

ROOM 20 NEWS

At the end of Term 3, the Year 6 cohort attended aquatics at Westlakes. We found it a really entertaining and a successful day out. When we arrived, we changed and met our instructors in our assigned groups. There were various activities including kayaking, canoeing, surfing and sailing. Each group had different timetables for when they did each activity. In kayaking we went up and down the lake, created a raft in our groups and to go left you had to paddle on the right side and to go right you have to paddle on the left side. In canoeing, we learnt how to create a raft and the person at the back of the canoe had to steer for the canoe to go in the right direction. During surfing we went to the beach because we needed the ocean for waves, to catch a wave you had to lay on your stomach and then get up to a standing position at the correct time, it was hard to keep your balance. During sailing we sat on the boat and ventured around the lake, some of us got to steer and even jump overboard. After each activity we learnt about the water safety acronyms WEET and SAFE, these helped us to remember what to do in an emergency and what to do before setting out on the river or ocean.

When making our necklaces, we focused on the mathematical concepts of pattern and measurement and used a range of mathematical vocabulary to work out how long or short we needed to make our necklaces. We also worked together to create a written procedure in class, which has been our literacy focus this term. We wrote our title 'How to Make a Colourful Necklace' and followed the structure of procedural writing. We made our procedure easy to follow using clear numbered steps with a range of verbs. We explained what materials we needed and had a goal. The students demonstrated team work and respect by helping each other alongside building on their problem-solving skills. The students loved making necklaces for the Village Fair!
